

Own Boat Tuition

Insurance

Your boat must have sufficient insurance cover, and as the owner you remain legally responsible for the safety of the craft, and for its insurance. Please call your insurance company prior to the session so that they know you will be having tuition or an ICC test.

Working order

Please make sure your boat is all ready, time spent getting engines to start, batteries charged or other problems will eat into your tuition time. As we have booked the instructor out for the day we cannot give any refunds when your vessel fails to work.

Safety Check List

As part of the course or test, the instructor will need to check the craft is of sound condition and run through safety equipment carried on board. The RYA publication 'boat safety' is a helpful guide to what you should be equipped with, as this depends on your cruising range/type of boat.

As a guide the following is a check list of the basic equipment we require you to have on board, if there any items you don't have then please contact us for advice.

Equipment list:

- In date Flare pack
- Life jackets
- Fire extinguishers
- VHF radio
- Anchor and suitable length of chain/warp.
- Bilge pumps
- Manual bilge pump/Bucket
- First aid kit
- Basic tool kit
- Torch/search light.
- Man over board device and means to get someone on back on board, varies depending on size/type of boat.
- Charts/publication up to date and covering area used.
- Compass
- Fog horn
- Tow line
- Life raft(optional depending on boats cruising area and size)
- The above is the essentials, and our instructors can advice depending on the type of boating you do.
